Earning UCLA Credit While Studying Abroad

UCLA offers many opportunities to take your learning beyond campus by studying abroad. The International Education Office ([IEO](#)) offers 180+ different opportunities to earn credit toward your degree all over the world!

Overview of Study Abroad Options

- **UCLA Travel Study** is a 3–5-week summer program taught by UCLA faculty.
- **UCLA Global Internship Program** is an 8-week summer internship program (academic credit, unpaid); opportunity to gain hands-on work experience in career field of interest and build a global network.
- **UC Education Abroad Program (UCEAP)** allows students to choose from summer, quarter, semester, and year-long programs; opportunity to do research, internships, or take academic classes for UC units; open to all UC students.

Earning UCLA Academic Credit Abroad

- **UCLA Travel Study**
 - Because all courses are taught by UCLA faculty, classes and grades automatically transfer to your UCLA transcript (as if you took the class on campus).
 - No petition needed.
- **UCLA Global Internship program**
 - All courses automatically transfer to UCLA transcript.
 - No petition needed.
- **UCEAP**
 - All courses, units, and grades will transfer to UCLA as unit credit towards the 180 unit minimum and your cumulative GPA.
 - To satisfy specific degree requirements, you must petition with the respective department.
 - For College requirements (e.g. GE, foreign language, Diversity), you should file a [Transfer Credit Petition](#) with your advising unit.
 - For major/minor requirements, check with your department.
- Many study abroad applications are released during Fall Quarter, so it may be helpful to plan ahead and meet with a [College Academic Advisor](#) to map out how studying abroad may fit into your degree plan.

Academic Residency While Studying Abroad

- If you are planning to study abroad in your final year at UCLA, we recommend meeting with a College Academic Advisor to ensure you meet the [Academic Residency requirements](#).
 - For students participating in a UCEAP program, the academic residency is automatically waived (holding the student to 35 of the last 90 units in residence).
 - Students studying abroad in non-UCEAP programs must [petition](#) senior residency but will usually be held to the same requirements as EAP participants. Major residency must still be met.
